- Students must complete the courses (including general courses) for at least 128 credits, including university core courses for 30 credits, college core courses for 10 credits, department core courses for 38 credits, complete one professional program in their own department and one specialty program (or interdisciplinary program) from other department or get a second specialty program for graduation. If there is a shortage, students can freely elect the courses other than general courses to make up the deficiency.

3. Students from Hong Kong, Macau, China, and overseas Chinese students enrolled in the university's standard liberal arts curriculum will be processed as international student standard curriculums.
